COVID-19 HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT



We pride ourselves on creating a family atmosphere, which provides a safe, caring and positive environment where all pupils are valued equally, regardless of ability, ethnic origin, gender, belief or social background.



Parents /Carers of the Pupil

- I will check my child is fit to attend school each morning before bringing them.
- If my child, or anyone in my household, shows symptoms of COVID-19, I will not send them to school. I will get them tested and I will let the school know as soon as possible via telephone.
- If my child shows symptoms of COVID-19 at school, I will collect my child from school immediately.
- When dropping my child off and picking them up, I will keep to the 2m social distancing rules.
- When dropping off and picking up, I will strictly stick to the school timings for my child.
- I will remind my child about social distancing rules but accept they are difficult to follow and that my child may not always do this successfully.
- I will observe safe social distancing rules and encourage other household members to do so.
- I will teach my child to use good respiratory hygiene and to wash their hands often.
- I will not come into the school with my child. I will email or telephone if I need to make an appointment.
- I will support all staff in their efforts to create an 'as safe as possible' environment during this time.
- I will read all letters/messages/emails that are sent home.
- I will encourage my child to complete home

The Pupil

I will do my best to:

- Keep to the social distancing rules in class and in the playground.
- Stay in my bubble all day.
- Tell an adult if I feel unwell.
- Only bring in things from home that I have been asked to. I will not take things home from school without checking.
- Not mix with any other bubbles in the school.
- Follow good hygiene rules: coughing and sneezing into elbow or tissue (catch it-bin it-kill it).
- Keep my hands clean – use soap and water for 20 seconds or hand sanitiser.
- Follow adult instructions at all times to maintain the safety of myself and others.
- Follow these expectations and know that if I don't, I will be sent home and will not be able to come back into school until I can be safe.
- Complete home learning set by my school and ask for help if I need it.

The School

The school will:

- Welcome children back to school sensitively, allowing them time to adjust to new routines.
- Provide an environment which has been risk assessed in response to the COVID-19 infection.
- Keep to the social distancing rules as set out by the government as much as we reasonably can.
- Provide a curriculum that meets the needs of your child's well-being and mental health.
- Continue our clear and consistent approach to help children understand the new rules and routines.
- Contact parents/carers if your child displays symptoms of COVID-19.
- Inform you of any relevant public health information regarding the school community.
- Communicate between home and school through newsletters, email and the school website.
