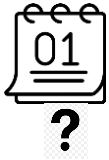


What may change?

Although the school will still be open for key workers' children and vulnerable children, if the Government's '5 tests' are satisfied, from June 1st we may be welcoming back children but only from Reception, Year 1 and Year 6.

How are you planning to make sure school is safe?



We will check for risks before school is open.



Everyone will wash their hands regularly.



If a child or family member is sick they can not come to school.



School will be cleaned everyday and deep cleaned every Wednesday.



There will be only half the class in a room together.



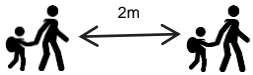
Each half class, will be treated as a 'bubble'.



To do this we will need to make changes to the school day.



The school crossing will operate from 0840 -0920 and 1430-1510



We will expect the 2m social distancing rule to apply at drop-off and pick up times AND at the crossing!



Please drop-off and pick up all siblings together at the earlier 'group' time.



Children must be dropped off and picked up at the designated point.



PLEASE wait outside - parents will be allowed access one at a time if they need to speak to one of us.



Only send one parent.

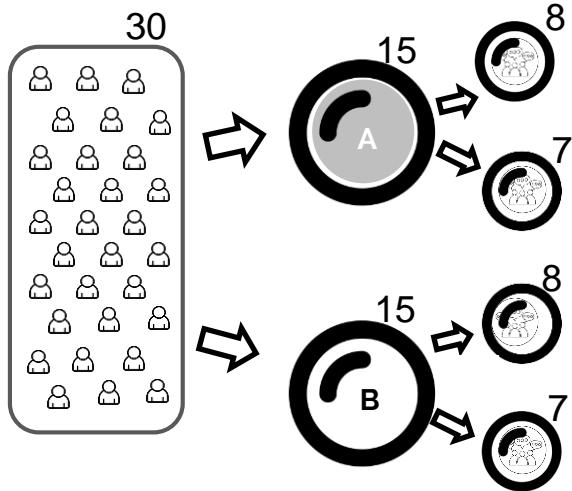
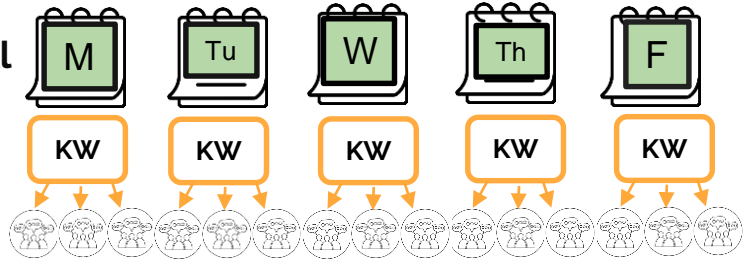
How will it work? (Part 1/2)

Key worker & vulnerable children Group

Drop-off 0830
Pick up 1600

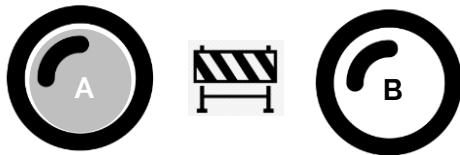


The KW 'bubble' will also divide into 'sub-bubbles' if needed.



Each eligible year group or class (FS, Y1 and Y6) will be split in to TWO 'bubbles' by their class teachers.

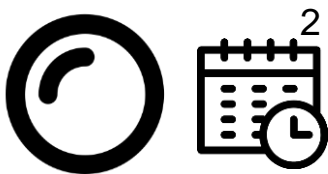
Each 'bubble' will then divide into two 'mini-bubbles' of 7 or 8. They will adhere to social distancing.



A and B bubbles will not mix with each another.



Mini-bubbles will be able 'mix' during outside break times adhering to social distancing.



Each 'bubble' has been allocated 2 days per week to attend school.



This is because we have limited space and reduced staff and we believe this keeps it safe for everyone.

What happens about shielding?



If your child is eligible to return but they are, you are or a member of the household is shielding, you must NOT send your child as we cannot guarantee stringent social distancing.

What if my child is in the Key worker group AND eligible year group?



If any child moves between bubbles and they test positive, we would then have to isolate more than one bubble for 14 days.



As a result, you will need to choose which bubble (key worker or Year) we place your child in as they will not be able to 'move' between the bubbles.



All parents/carers must continue to do everything they can to ensure children are not mixing socially outside of school.

Will my child be tested ?



PLEASE CHECK YOUR CHILD'S TEMPERATURE AT HOME

We will NOT take temperatures before each child enters school.



Those children eligible to return to their settings will have access to testing if they display symptoms, as will any symptomatic members of their household.

What if there is a suspected case of Coronavirus in school?



The person with symptoms must self isolate for 7 days unless they are 'tested' and the test is negative. The bubble continues to attend school.



The people they 'live' with must then self isolate for 14 days unless they too are 'tested' and their own test is negative. The bubble continues to attend school.



If anyone at school tests positive, that whole 'bubble' including adults must self isolate for 14 days.

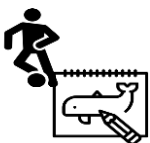
What else might change?



We will change how we serve lunch. Free school dinners will be available for FS and Y1. Y6 will need a packed lunch. All lunches will be taken in their classrooms.



Your child may have a different classroom & teacher than normal BUT we are aiming for them to be the same each time they come to school. The Key Worker group will continue to be supported by staff on a rota.



They may not have all their normal lessons.

What will those coming into school need?



School uniform is not compulsory –but please dress appropriately.



No PE kit ; clothes ready for outside instead.



Different clothing each day



Trainers – with laces if they can do them, if not the velcro.



Tissues for just them



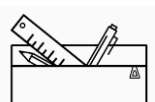
