Eco-Schools Topic:

Aim:

- To create a litter pickers rota.

The eco-committee members need to remind classmates about use of bins.  
School finance need to purchase suitable bins.

Playground checks.  
Bin checks.

Evaluation:

**Waste**

Aim:  
To dispose of food waste correctly.  
To recycle as many items as possible in school.

Action(s):

- Food bins to be purchased and placed on playground.
- Investigate recycling of plastics and other items.
- Label recycling bins correctly.
- Packed lunch waste is to be taken home to be recycled.
- Food waste to be collected in classrooms and disposed of in new food bins.

How long will it take?

Lunchtime staff needs to remind children about waste disposal.  
Pupils will need to dispose of food waste daily into the correct bins.  
Parents and pupils should recycle packed lunch waste correctly when they get home.  
School finance need to purchase suitable bins.
